

Summer of Psalms: Sermon Study Along

PSALM 139

The format of this study guide is to help facilitate good Bible study practices and group discussion. You are encouraged to follow each section to the best of your ability, and use resources to help fill any gaps or questions you might have about the text. Following the guide are some responses of various pastors at Del Sol Church. These are not to provide you with exact answers, but intended to help your study as you can observe the way they have completed each section.

READ IT

Read the full Psalms 139 text in your preferred Bible version.

THINK IT

In your physical Bible or Bible app, highlight two or more phrases that sound interesting, deep, questioning, confusing, enlightening, etc. The point here is to start the study by finding what sections of the chapter stood out to you.

SHARE IT

Now you will take a moment to summarize the text, but in your own words.

CONNECT IT

Now that you have worked through the text, take note of two or more phrases within the chapter that brought to mind other sections of the Bible.

DISCUSS IT

First answer these two questions by making a list:

- •What does the text say about human beings?
- •What does the text say about God?

Now answer any of the following prompts/questions that stand out to you and discuss with your family or a small group.

- •Considering what Psalm 139 says about God intimately knowing you, always being next to you in love, and even present when you were created in your mother womb, how would you describe your relationship with God at this very moment?
- Are there people in your life you see adamantly against God and His ways? How would you describe them and their behavior?
- •Why do you think David asks God to search him even though David opened the psalm declaring God to know him already? How would you connect this request to verses 19-20?
- Have you asked God to search your heart lately, if so, what has he revealed to you?

DO IT

Last, take a moment to reflect on your study and responses to this section, and answer this question: If this is God's word for you, you personally, what are you going to do about it this next week? Phrase your answer by starting with an "I will..."
